Honors and Awards

2001 - Present

Yuko Aoyama was awarded the Abe Fellowship for 2001-02 by the Social Science Research Council. This award is designed to encourage international multidisciplinary research on topics of pressing global concern, and is awarded to a new generation of researchers who study policy-relevant topics of long-range importance.

Jean Borgatti received a Fulbright Teaching/Research grant for continuation of work in Nigeria on aesthetic preference among the Okpella, a people whose traditional arts she documented in the early 1970's.

Jacqueline Geoghegan and **Valerie Sperling** were awarded the Edward Hodgkins Junior Faculty Fellowships for personifying the Clark ideal of excellence in research and in teaching.

Harvey Gould was appointed Associate Editor of the *American Journal of Physics* for a multi-year term beginning in July, 2001.

Beverly Grier was elected to the post of Vice President and then President of the African Studies Association for a three-year term beginning in November, 2002.

Susan Hanson was appointed as The Jan and Larry Landry University Professor on September 1, 2001. This professorship is designated for "an academic leader... who, by his or her presence on campus, symbolizes the aspirations of the University in higher education."

Susan Hanson is a Fellow at the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences at Stanford University during the 2001-02 academic year.

David Joyce won one of five Sci/Tech Web Awards in the category of mathematics given by *Scientific American* for his homepage. The listing states that Professor Joyce "... has collected a wealth of fascinating pages on mathematical topics ranging from wallpaper groups to Mandelbrot sets to kaleidoscopes... Other pages provide short courses on trigonometry and complex numbers, lessons in mathematical history, a copy of Euclid's *Elements*, and all 23 of David Hilbert's famous problems."

Mark Miller won the Seymour Logan Faculty Fellowship for 2001-03 for his topic, "The Supreme Court in the 21st Century," and because of his outstanding record as a teacher and mentor of Clark students.

Heather Roberts was chosen as Outstanding Academic Advisor for the 2000-01 academic year.

Dianne Rocheleau received a funded residential fellowship at the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Studies at Harvard University for September 2002-June 2003, for work on a book, *The Invisible Ecologies of Machakos District Kenya: Landscapes, Livelihoods and Life Histories, 1890-1990*.

Shelly Tenenbaum was selected as Teacher of the Year by the graduating class of 2001.

Jaan Valsiner was awarded the 2001 University Senior Faculty fellowship, presented to an outstanding senior faculty member who personifies the Clark ideal of excellence in teaching and excellence in research, scholarship, or creative work.
