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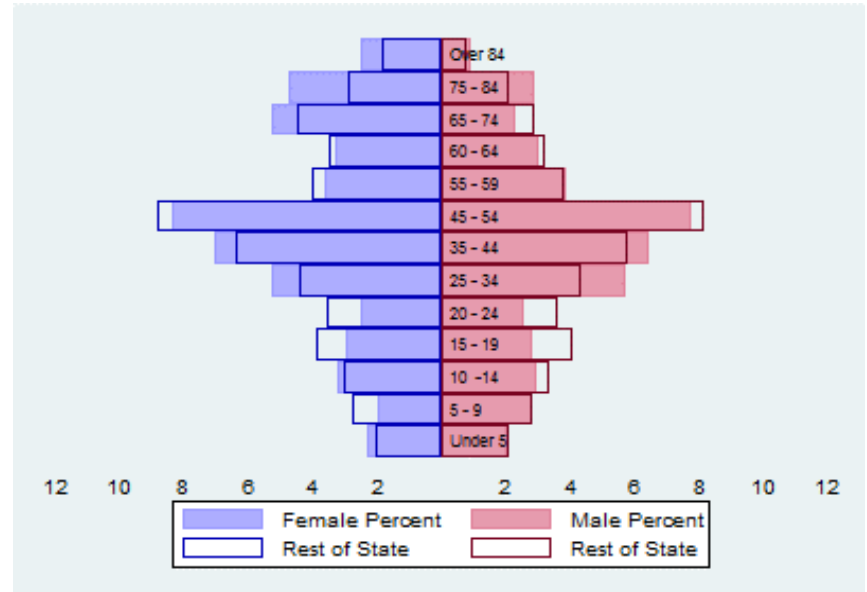

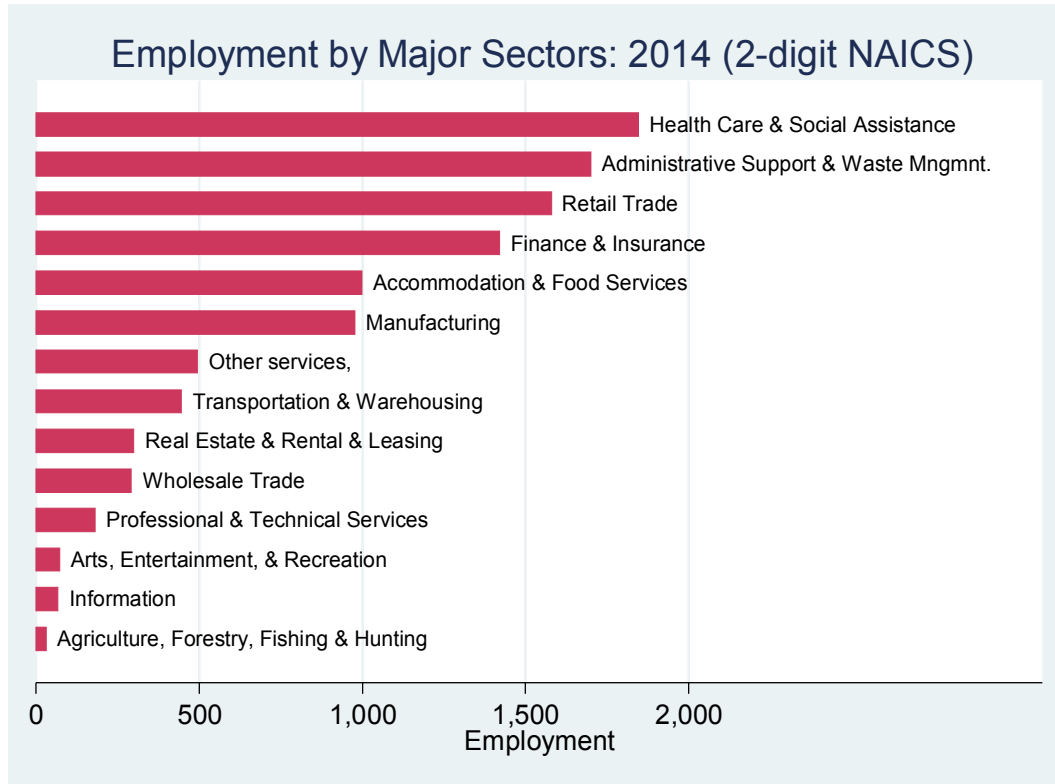

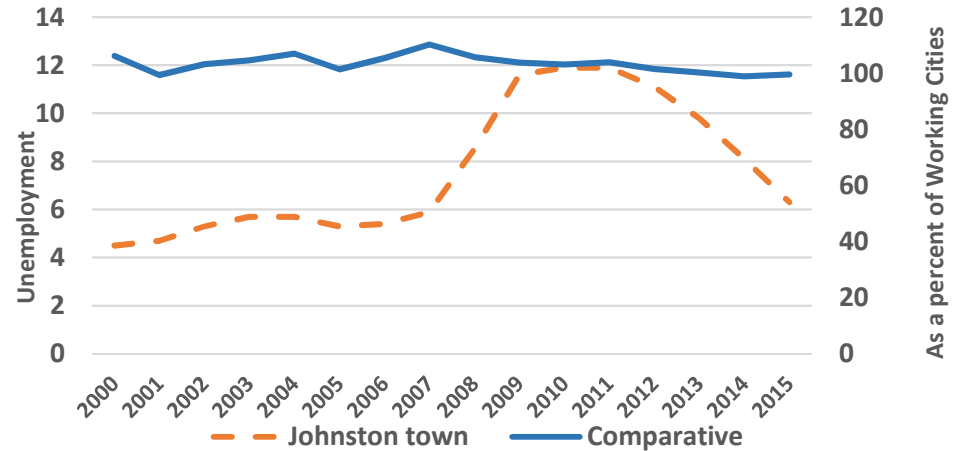
Educational Attainment of the Population Aged 25 and Older

Unemployment Rate 2000 - 2015



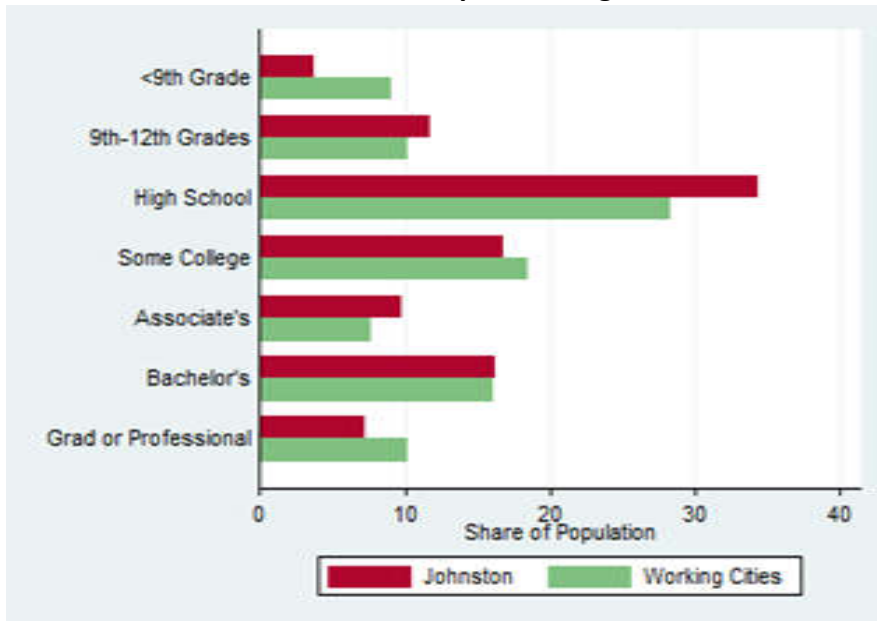

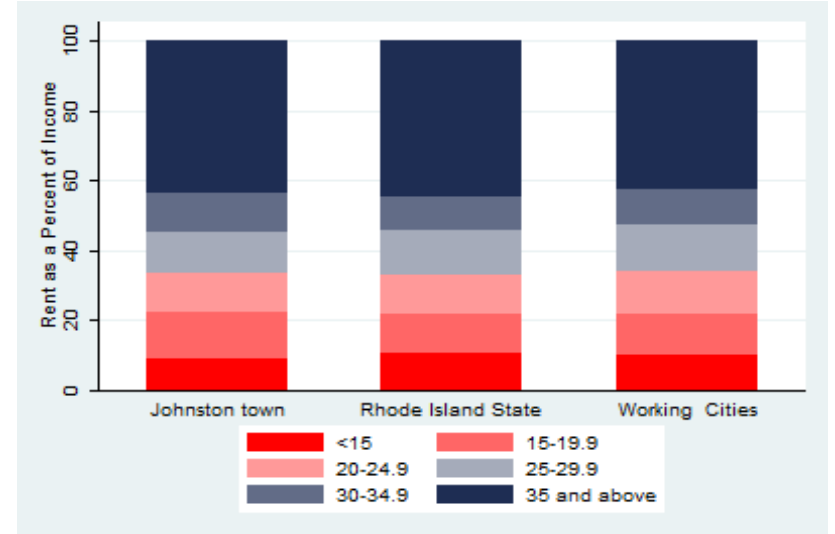
