## Rev. Earl Clement Davis Installed at Concord, N.H.

By an altar banked with palms and daffodils, Rev. Earl Clement Davis was installed as minister of the Second Congregational (Unitarian) Church in Concord, N.H., Sunday afternoon, March 9.

Five ministers took part in the service. Rev. George H. Reed, pastor of the First Congregational Church, delivered the invocation; Rev. Harry F. Shook, newly installed pastor of White Memorial Universalist Church, read the Scripture; the installation sermon was delivered by Rev. William Wallace Fenn, D.D., of the Theological School in Harvard University; the act of installation was performed by George Arthur Foster, chairman of the prudential committee; Rev. George F. Patterson, whom Mr. Davis succeeds as pastor of the church, delivered the address to the minister and congregation, and the fellowship of the churches was extended by Rev. Raymond H. Huse, pastor of Baker Memorial Church.

In his installation sermon Dr. Fenn stressed individual responsibility. There is a tendency to-day, he declared, to blame society for the misdeeds of the individual man.

Mr. Davis was formerly minister of Unity Church in Pittsfield, Mass., for fourteen years. From Pittsfield he went to Lancaster, Pa., where he remained for nearly five years before accepting the call to the Concord church.
