




- Who is Anderson?

a certain parcel of land situated on the southerly side of Woodland Street, Worcester, Massachusetts, and bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point where the southerly line of said Woodland Street intersects with the easterly line of Hawthorne Street;

THENCE easterly on said southerly line of Woodland Street one hundred twenty (120) feet to a bound;

THENCE southerly on a line parallel with said easterly line of Hawthorne Street one hundred (100) feet to a bound;

THENCE westerly on a line parallel with said southerly line of Woodland Street one hundred twenty (120) feet to said easterly line of said Hawthorne Street;

THENCE northerly on said easterly line of Hawthorne Street one hundred (100) feet to the place of beginning.






1886 Worcester City Atlas



Researching in the Archive: History of the English Department

- Originally part of Clark College, not Clark University
- English and History office were located in the same office in Clark College, room 51 (in what is now Jonas Clark hall)
- English Dept. moves to "English House" at 12 Hawthorne in late 1960s
- Originally had a garage behind/beside the house on the property, also purchased by Clark
- House contained many stained glass windows (now stolen) from earlier residents.
- Shifts in the curriculum over time
