Mary-Ellen Boyle (and Ira Silver)'s research article, published in 2005, "Poverty, Partnerships, and Privilege: Elite Institutions and Community Empowerment" won the prize for faculty research given by the Poverty Class and Inequality section of the Society for the Study of Social Problems. The award was announced in August at the Society's annual meeting in Montreal.

Sarah Buie and **Winston Napier**, on behalf of the Higgins School of Humanities, were recognized by the U.S. Postal Service for community-outreach achievement for the School's *African American Intellectual Culture Series*, initiated and hosted by Professor Napier.

Esteban Cardemil, **Betsy Huang** and **Kristina Wilson** were awarded Edward Hodgkins Junior Faculty Fellowships for personifying the Clark ideal of excellence in research and in teaching.

Brian Cook will receive the Elmer Plischke Annual Faculty Research Award in Political Science from the Lutheran Community Foundation, for his 2007 book, *Democracy and Administration: Woodrow Wilson's Ideas and the Challenges of Public Management*. The award will be presented in May.

Gino DiIorio was awarded the 2006 Oliver and Dorothy Hayden Junior Faculty Fellowship, presented to an outstanding junior faculty member who personifies the Clark ideal of excellence in teaching and excellence in research, scholarship, or creative work.

Gino DiIorio received an American Antiquarian Society Research Fellowship for 2007, for his proposal to research and write a play on Republican Senator Edmund Ross.

Gino DiIorio is the winner of Urban Stages' 2007 *Emerging Playwrights Award* for his new play, *Apostasy*, currently in production at the Urban States Theatre, in New York City. This prize is presented to an innovative playwright whose work is both multi-cultural and issue-oriented.

Duncan Earle was nominated and elevated to “Fellow” of the Society for Applied Anthropology, culminating with two panels, one of them showcasing seven Clark undergraduate students, at their annual meeting in Tampa, Florida in March.

Cynthia Enloe received the Susan Strange Award from the International Studies Association, which recognizes a person whose singular intellect, assertiveness and insight most challenge conventional wisdom and intellectual and organizational complacency in the international studies community during the previous year. She is the first woman to receive this award in the history of the ISA. She accepted the award at the ISA’s national convention in February, 2007.

Patricia Ewick was awarded the 2006 University Senior Faculty Fellowship, presented to an outstanding senior faculty member who personifies the Clark ideal of excellence in teaching and excellence in research, scholarship, or creative work.

SunHee Kim Gertz won a DAAD (Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst/German Academic Exchange Service) Summer Fellowship for 2007, to complete research on her 4th monograph (5th book), “The Rhetoric of Statesmanship in Edward the Black Prince, Geoffrey Chaucer, and René d’Anjou.”

Jacqueline Geoghegan was recently recognized with an Article-of-the Year award by the Northeastern Agricultural and Resource Economics Association for “Modeling and Managing Urban Growth at the Rural-Urban Fringe: A Parcel-Level Model of Residential Land Use Change,” which she co-authored with Elena Irwin and Kathleen Bell.

Betsy Huang was selected to receive the Outstanding Teacher Award by the graduating class of 2006.
