In this course we will read and discuss works of post-world war II literature written in German. Authors to be discussed include Paul Celan, Wolfgang Borchert, Ilse Aichinger, Bertolt Brecht, Wolfgang Koeppen, Heinar Kipphardt, Friedrich Dürrenmatt, and Christa Wolf.

Grading will be based on classroom participation and a variety of written projects:

2 2-page written papers (in German)	20%
1 "glossed" text (in German)	10%
1 movie review (in German)	5%
1 10-page research paper (in English or German)	30%
1 presentation (in English or German)	10%
classroom participation (in English and German)	25%

For your "glossed" text, I would like you to take a short passage that we have read, learn it thoroughly, mount it on construction paper (or something similar) and connect it with images, thoughts, texts, definitions, etc., that make it meaningful to you. Be creative!

For your movie review, you will need to sign up for one of the movies shown this semester and write a review of it, which you will distribute to the class. This will be due in class, the Tuesday after the movie is shown.

Your research paper should be a real research paper, with secondary literature, etc. You will need to use bibliographic sources like the MLA bibliography. You may well have to use interlibrary loan, so work in advance.

Your presentation will consist of observations and questions that start a class discussion. You are responsible for the classroom discussion, so be interesting.

Attendance is very important in a discussion-oriented class, so come on time everytime. More than three unexcused absences will result in the loss of a full letter grade from your final grade. Frequent tardiness will result in a half-grade deduction from your final grade.
