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Love and death, sexuality and sickness, desire and disease ... these are constantly recurring themes in the German tradition. In this course, we can analyze why and how the "Liebestod" theme has such a powerful hold in German literature. We will begin with the *locus classicus* of the love-death, which is the Tristan myth, pursuing it from its medieval origins, through its apex in Wagner's opera, to Thomas Mann's spoof of it. We will then look at a cluster of classical German texts that feature tragic intertwinings of love and death.

Class requirements:

1)	one paper in German on the Liebestod tradition (5 pages)	20%
2)	a preliminary version of the research paper (4-5 pages)	10%
3)	a research paper (10 pages)	20%
4)	report on secondary literature	10%
5)	leading a class discussion	10%
6)	class participation	30%

- 1) Write one paper of about 5 pages in German on the Liebestod tradition.
- 2) By Thanksgiving break, give me a preliminary version of the research paper, with some kind of thesis, some arguments. Be sure to include secondary literature, as I want to be able to check your citation format. This paper can be in English or German. What counts is literary analysis! I will give you feedback on this version of the paper, which you can than use to rework your final paper.
- 3) The final paper should be about 10 pages long, have an original thesis, and also deal extensively with secondary literature. You should be able to locate at least five pieces of secondary literature.
- 4) Sign up to give a report on some of the secondary literature on a specific author. Include a written bibliography for your colleagues.
- 5) Lead a class discussion on one of the works.
- 6) Participate in the class discussions!
