"Introduction to Gender Studies" provides students with the intellectual framework to understand and analyze gender. Using a variety of sources from theory, literature, and other media, we will study femininity, masculinity, and some of the steps in between.

Assignments:

Papers: 60%

A *personal* paper discussing the significance of gender to your own life. Five pages. (15%)

A political paper addressing some situation in current events, preferably using insights gained from course readings. Five pages. (15%)
An analytical research paper focusing on course readings. Ten pages. (30%)

Team discussion leading: 10%

Groups of students will lead discussions on the literary works.

Participation: 20%

Everyone needs to contribute to the class discussion.

Final: 10%

This is your chance to demonstrate that you have read all the required texts and know what they are about.

Attendance: is crucial to the liberal arts experience. After three unexcused absences, I will lower your overall grade by a letter. Excused absences are only those that the Dean of Students issues, for certain approved curricular and extracurricular activities and for sickness or family emergencies. In all cases, a note from the Dean of Students is necessary for an absence to count as excused.

Lateness: Papers are due on Fridays before the office in Mem closes, which is generally between 4 and 5. If you hand a paper in on Monday, it will be marked down by a half a grade; an additional half grade will come off the paper for each subsequent day of lateness.
