## *About Clark University*

Clark is a private, liberal arts University which offers its over 2,000 graduate and undergraduate students the advantages of a large institution while maintaining a small-college atmosphere. Located in Worcester, Massachusetts, in the geographical center of New England, Clark's 40-acre campus is set in an urban residential environment.

Clark's Graduate School was opened in 1889. It is not only the oldest in the Northeast, but also the second oldest in the nation. In 1902, the University added a separate Undergraduate College for men, which became coeducational in 1942. In 1953 the University's service to the local community was reinforced and its scope broadened with the formation of an Evening College. By 1975 the College of Professional and Continuing Education had succeeded the evening program with expanded and improved course offerings, including new masters programs.

Built upon the work of scholar/teachers such as Robert H. Goddard, "father" of the Space Age, and Albert A. Michelson, America's first Nobel laureate, Clark's tradition of academic vitality and versatility continues today. As the smallest member of the select Association of American Universities, Clark features small classes; close relationships among students, faculty, and administration; strong interaction between graduate and undergraduate students; and opportunities for interdisciplinary and independent study. The University offers integrated B.A./M.A. and M.A./Ph.D. degree programs; a cooperative program with the nationally recognized Worcester Art Museum; and cross registration with ten other area institutions through the Worcester Consortium for Higher Education.
