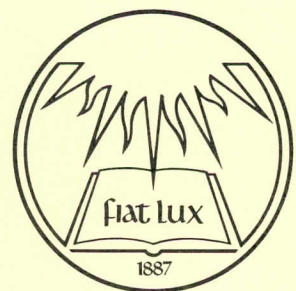

## HISTORICAL NOTE

Clark University was founded in 1887 as a graduate institution, and its undergraduate college was established in 1902. During the early years of the University, graduate degrees were awarded on an individual basis. Formal commencement exercises began at Clark in June 1905, when bachelor's degrees were awarded for the first time. Today, the annual spring commencement rite publicly recognizes those who have earned degrees throughout the year.

During today's activities, an information center is located in the lobby of Atwood Hall. A reception for graduates and guests will be held at the Student Activities Center immediately following the exercises.

## HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

**Linus Pauling** is professor of chemistry emeritus at Stanford University and research professor at the Linus Pauling Institute of Science and Medicine in Menlo Park, California. He resides in Big Sur. In 1954 he was awarded the Nobel Prize in chemistry for his research on the nature of the chemical bond. He received the 1962 Nobel Peace Prize for his campaign against nuclear weapons and tests. His contributions to the fields of chemistry and medicine, and to the cause of world peace, have been recognized with numerous other awards including the National Medal of Science, the Chemical Sciences Award of the National Academy of Sciences, the International Lenin Peace Prize, and the Ghandi Peace Prize.

**Archibald Cox**, a leading authority on constitutional law and labor law, is Carl M. Loeb University Professor at Harvard University. He has been a member of the Harvard faculty since 1945, taking leave for periods of government service during the administrations of Presidents Truman, Kennedy, and Johnson. In 1973 he served as the first Watergate special prosecutor until he was dismissed by President Nixon during the "Saturday night massacre" in October of that year. In February of this year Professor Cox was named chairman of Common Cause. He lives in Wayland, Massachusetts.

**George F. Kneller**, a 1929 graduate of Clark University, is a professor emeritus and former chairman of the Education Department of the University of California at Los Angeles. A resident of Los Angeles, he is the author of many books, including *Science as a Human Endeavor*, published by Columbia University Press, and he has been a member of the board of editors of the *Encyclopedia Britannica* since 1968.

**Robert K. Massey**, of Holden, Massachusetts, a semi-retired investment adviser, has been a member of Clark University's Board of Trustees since 1968 and served as board co-chairman from 1974 to 1979. He is a 1937 alumnus of Amherst College. He has been active in Worcester community affairs for the past fifteen years and has held leadership positions with numerous community agencies.



## ACADEMIC DRESS

From the cap, gown, and hood it is possible to distinguish the institution from which the wearer was graduated, the field of learning in which his or her degree was earned, and the level of the degree—bachelor's, master's, or doctor's.

The distinguishing feature of the black mortarboard cap, standard at most colleges and universities in the United States, is the color of the tassel—black for the holder of bachelor's or master's degrees, gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

The gown is normally black, although the chief officers of many universities wear colored gowns, and several institutions have authorized optional doctoral gowns which embody the institution's colors. The level of the degree is indicated by the gown's cut. The bachelor's gown, which is relatively simple, has long pointed sleeves. The master's gown is somewhat fuller, and its sleeves, which reach nearly to the wearer's knees, are square at the ends. The gown for the doctor's degree is cut rather full, velvet panels reach down the front and around the neck, and the sleeves are bell-shaped and decorated with three horizontal velvet bars.

The hood is the most distinctive feature of academic attire in the United States. Originally used as a cowl, as a shoulder cape, and as a container in which to collect alms, it is now worn at the back, suspended from the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. The length of the bachelor's hood is three feet, and the velvet border is two inches; the hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long with a three-inch border; the doctor's hood is four feet long, and the border is five inches wide. The hood is lined with the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree, and the color of the border indicates the field of learning in which the degree is earned.

Members of the governing body of a college or university are entitled to wear doctor's gowns, although the hoods represent the degrees actually held by the wearers or prescribed for them by the institution. The chief marshal may wear an especially designed costume approved by the institution. Military uniforms and religious habits are also appropriate apparel at academic convocations.

Colors indicating the field of learning: Arts, Letters and Humanities—white; Business Administration—drab; Economics—copper; Education—light blue; Engineering—orange; Fine Arts—brown; Law—purple; Medicine—green; Music—pink; Philosophy—dark blue; Public Service—peach; Science—golden yellow; Theology—scarlet.
