HISTORICAL NOTE

Clark University was founded in 1887 as a graduate institution, and its undergraduate college was established in 1902. During the early years of the University, graduate degrees were awarded on an individual basis. Formal commencement exercises began at Clark in June 1905, when bachelor's degrees were awarded for the first time. Today, the annual spring commencement rite publicly recognizes those who have earned degrees throughout the year.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

Frank Press, Institute Professor at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, has been elected the nineteenth president of the National Academy of Sciences, an office he will assume July 1. Dr. Press's primary scientific activities have been in seismology and the study of the earth's deep interior, and he is recognized internationally for his pioneering contributions in geophysics, oceanography, lunar and planetary sciences, and natural resource exploration. Having joined the M.I.T. faculty in 1965, he headed the Department of Earth and Planetary Sciences (formerly Geology and Geophysics) for twelve years before accepting a presidential appointment in 1977. He served as President Carter's science adviser and director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy. Dr. Press returned to M.I.T. last January, when he was appointed Institute Professor, a title M.I.T. reserves for scholars of special distinction. A leader in major national and international projects, Dr. Press helped organize the International Geophysical Year (IGY), the first coordinated worldwide attempt to measure and map various geophysical phenomena. The ten-year IGY effort involved international explorations of the oceans and Antarctica, where Mt. Press is named for him. Dr. Press received his undergraduate degree in physics from City College of New York and his advanced degrees in geophysics from Columbia University.

Stephen T. Riley, a native of Worcester, received his bachelor's degree at Clark fifty years ago this spring. He also holds M.A. and Ph.D. degrees awarded him by the University in 1932 and 1953, respectively. Dr. Riley joined the Massachusetts Historical Society as assistant librarian in 1934, was its director and librarian (1957-73), and is today its director emeritus. During nearly half a century with the Boston institution — the oldest private research society in American history — Dr. Riley has concentrated on building the society's manuscript collection. He has served in an advisory capacity on the Adams Family Papers, George Washington Papers, and Daniel Webster Papers. A member of the American Antiquarian Society and many other prestigious historical and scholarly organizations, Dr. Riley has been a trustee of Clark University since 1963.

Richard C. Steele, president and publisher of the Worcester Telegram & Gazette Inc., is a community leader. Having chaired the fundraising efforts that made possible the restoration of Mechanics Hall, "Worcester's landmark," he has just assumed the presidency of the Worcester County Mechanics Association, owners of the hall. He was president of the United Way of Central Massachusetts (1980-81) and chaired the initial phase of "This Is Worcester . . .", a three-year project that sought to define Worcester by spotlighting achievable solutions to the city's problems and by creatively emphasizing the city's positive aspects. Mr. Steele (was first vice chair of the Associated Press in 1976,) is past president of the American Newspaper Publishers Association Research Institute, past board chair of the ANPA Foundation, and past president of the New England Daily Newspaper Association.

David B. Wingate, M.B.E., lives in his native Bermuda, where he heads the conservation division of the island's Department of Agriculture and Fisheries. Since his graduation from Cornell University in 1957, he has been the director of several programs to conserve and protect the birds and the unique ecosystem of Bermuda. His work is largely responsible for saving the Bermuda petrel, or cahow, from extinction. He is currently involved in a special project on fifteen-acre Nonsuch Island, where more than six thousand native and endemic trees and shrubs are being planted in an attempt to create a living facsimile of Bermuda as it was before being inhabited by man.

ACADEMIC DRESS

From the cap, gown, and hood it is possible to distinguish the institution from which the wearer was graduated, the field of learning in which his or her degree was earned, and the level of the degree—bachelor's, master's, or doctor's.

The distinguishing feature of the black mortarboard cap, standard at most colleges and universities in the United States, is the color of the tassel—black for the holder of bachelor's or master's degrees, gold for doctor's degrees and the governing officers of educational institutions.

The gown is normally black, although the chief officers of many universities wear colored gowns, and several institutions have authorized optional doctoral gowns which embody the institution's colors. The level of the degree is indicated by the gown's cut. The bachelor's gown, which is relatively simple, has long pointed sleeves. The master's gown is somewhat fuller, and its sleeves, which reach nearly to the wearer's knees, are square at the ends. The gown for the doctor's degree is cut rather full, velvet panels reach down the front and around the neck, and the sleeves are bell-shaped and decorated with three horizontal velvet bars.

The hood is the most distinctive feature of the academic attire in the United States. Originally used as a cowl, as a shoulder cape, and as a container in which to collect alms, it is now worn at the back, suspended from the shoulders. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet border indicate the level of the degree held. The length of the bachelor's hood is three feet, and the velvet border is two inches; the hood for the master's degree is three and one-half feet long with a three-inch border; the doctor's hood is four feet long, and the border is five inches wide. The hood is lined with the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree, and the color of the border indicates the field of learning in which the degree is earned.

Members of the governing body of a college or university are entitled to wear doctor's gowns, although the hoods represent the degrees actually held by the wearers or prescribed for them by the institution. The chief marshal may wear an especially designed costume approved by the institution. Military uniforms and religious habits are also appropriate apparel at academic convocations.

Colors indicating the field of learning: **Arts, Letters and Humanities**—white; **Business Administration**—drab; **Economics**—copper; **Education**—light blue; **Engineering**—orange; **Fine Arts**—brown; **Law**—purple; **Medicine**—green; **Music**—pink; **Philosophy**—dark blue; **Public Service**—peach; **Science**—golden yellow; **Theology**—scarlet.
