Frederick M. Lawrence, J.D. Secretary/CEO Phi Beta Kappa

Frederick M. Lawrence is the 10th Secretary and CEO of the Phi Beta Kappa Society, the nation's first and most prestigious honor society, founded in 1776. Lawrence is a Distinguished Lecturer at the Georgetown Law Center, and has previously served as president of Brandeis University, Dean of the George Washington University Law School, and Visiting Professor and Senior Research Scholar at Yale Law School. He was elected to the American Philosophical Society in 2018 and the American Law Institute in 1999. Lawrence is the recipient of the 2019 Ernest L. Boyer Award from the New American Colleges and Universities, and the Council of Colleges of Arts and Sciences' Arts & Sciences Advocacy Award in 2018. B.A., Williams College; J.D., Yale University



David Fithian, Ph.D. Clark University President Phi Beta Kappa Member

David Fithian '87, a proud alumnus and a distinguished leader in the world of higher education, was named the president of Clark University in January 2020, only the 10th person to hold the position since the University was founded in 1887. He came to Clark from the University of Chicago, where he served as executive vice president. Before joining Chicago in 2007, Fithian served for 12 years at Harvard, as assistant dean of freshmen and, later, the Allston Burr Senior Tutor (resident dean) of Adams House. Sebastián Royo is Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs and Professor of Political Science at Clark University. Prior to that, he served as Vice President of International Affairs and Professor in the Department of Political Science & Legal Studies at Suffolk University in Boston, where he also served as Acting Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs between August 2016 and August 2019. He was a Visiting Scholar at Harvard University's Minda de Gunzburg Center for European Studies in 2019-20. Royo holds a law degree from the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid, a master of arts in international relations, a master of business administration, and a Ph.D. in political science all from Boston University.
